
PICTURES FROM THE SCOUTING TRIP

NOTES ABOUT BENEFITS

Shipmates-

When each one of us enlisted, we signed a blank check to our government for up to and including our lives. And some paid that amount. Part of the 'interest' of writing that check includes healthcare, education and training, home loan guaranty, small business loans, life insurance and burial benefits. Most of these benefits are provided through the Department of Veterans Affairs, or VA. Depending on your income and healthcare plan, you can enroll in VA medical. If you were injured or aggravated an existing condition during your enlistment, you may be eligible for VA monetary and healthcare benefits. Did you know that the VA can help you purchase a home? Up to \$417,000 loan guaranty and 0 down payment. Check with your Veterans Service Officer at your local VFW, VVA, AM Vets, DAV or American Legion office for FREE assistance.

If you are enrolled for VA healthcare and in Priority Group 3, you may not be required to sign up for the Affordable Healthcare (Obama care) Insurance if you are otherwise uninsured.

Business loans are handled through the Small Business Administration, or SBA. You can start or expand a business with a VA Small Business loan. Any bank which participates with the SBA can give you more details.

Eligibility for VA benefits include an other than dishonorable discharge from active duty (18 months minimum). You will be required to provide a copy of your DD 214 (or DD 215) discharge document. Your Veterans Service Officer will assist you in obtaining this document if you don't have one. Contact me at the reunion, I'll be happy to help answer your questions.

As a veteran you may have two benefits that can change your future. Request more information about your top benefits, the <u>VA Loan</u> and <u>GI Bill.</u> You can refinance or buy a house with your VA Loan with \$0 down payment, and rates are low with financing of up to \$417,000. Check with your lending institution or a Veterans advocate.

You can eliminate time in the classroom with ACE and CLEP, and many schools offer credit for your military experience and training. The GI Bill can be worth up to \$52,500. Check with your School with VA approved Programs.

Did you know that you are eligible for eye and ear care (glasses & hearing aids) now if you have at least a 10% disability or more? VA law was changed recently, and everyone who has any type of disability is covered for those 2 new things. So if your arms are getting too short, the VA will provide new glasses. Might be a copay, you'll have to check on that.

Homeless Vets now have additional benefits. The VA will help you get housing, and job training.
