

3. Captain Carl Jay McCann, USN 5/22/1972 – 5/24/1973



Capt. McCann entered the Naval Service in May 1943. Upon Commission in 1945, he was assigned USS YMS 468 where he participated in minesweeping operation in the harbors of Sasebo, Japan and Pusan Korea and off the coast of China from Shanghai. He was released to inactive duty in August of 1946. He returned to active duty in June 1951 and was assigned to staff of Commander, LSD Division 22. His next assignments were to the Naval Amphibious Base, Little Creek; Operations Officer USS FLECHTELER (DDR-870); Commander DESDIV 232; Staff, Commander, Amphibious Force, Pacific Fleet; Executive Officer USS HENRY W. TUCKER (DDR-875); Commanding Officer USS VERNON COUNTY (LST-1161); Commander LSTDIV 92; study at Naval Postgraduate School where he earned a Master Degree in Personnel Management; Commanding Officer USS MORTON (DD-948); Director PERS C1, Bureau of Naval Personnel; student at the Canadian National Defense College; Commanding Office, Enlisted Personnel Distribution Office, Atlantic, with additional duty Fleet Personnel Officer. Capt. McCann completed active duty as Assistant Chief of Staff for Administration and District Inspector General Commandant Third Naval District. He retired on June 1, 1977. Following his retirement, he and his wife Eileen made their home in Virginia Beach where he was employed as Treasurer/Manager of St. Matthews Federal Credit Union.
