Letter from The Association President

We were fortunate to have a total of ten former COs join us on those calls. What an honor and privilege it was to have every CO we approach agree to be on the call from the decade they served.

It was a great time of sharing and many sailors were able to speak to shipmates they had lost contact with. We will be doing another round of these ZOOM calls starting in early 2021. I ENCOURAGE EVERYONE TO WATCH FOR THE EMAILS AND POSTINGS AND PLAN TO ATTEND. Everyone is encouraged to join in any of the calls and hear stories from other decades.

We are still studying what to do for a 2021 Reunion. Much of it will depend on just how fast and effective the vaccine will be, when it will be available and whether hotels and other places will be open to meet the way we want to gather. STANDBY!

Story From a SHIPMATE

When it happened, we were in the Mediterranean although I do not remember where exactly. I got a broken tooth while working in the aft engine room. Went up to medical, saw the 1st class corpsman and he looked in my mouth. He said that it looked fine but called Doc in to look anyway. Doc looks in my mouth and says, "Hey, you got a broken tooth. Let's see if we can take out the broke part." Doc asks me how I managed to get a tooth broke while on duty. I told him I had slipped and fell and that I had hit my jaw when I fell and guess that's when the tooth got broke. I couldn't tell them that it was actually from a fight because they would have written me up (plus probably asked a lot more questions).

Well, Doc reaches in my mouth with some tools to try to extract the broken part but, as soon as he touched it (the tooth was in the back on bottom), I let out a yell. So, Doc stopped. He gave me some Tylenol 3 (the fix all for everything back then) and said he'd figure out what to do. Doc told me that I could go back to work until then, so I went back to the pit.

The Doc calls me and says they're looking to fly me over to the carrier (I think it was JFK) to see a dentist. A couple of hours later Doc calls me again and says they're looking to fly me to Crete. Finally, the next day he calls me and says we were just 2 days from Israel, and they were going to get it fixed there. I tell him, "Sir, this hurts like a SOB" so he gives me some Vicodin (which you could take and work even though you might be a bit out of it) and says, "This should get you through until then."

So, I keep working in the pit until we pull into Haifa, Israel. Doc calls me and tells me be in civvies (we had to wear civilian attire when going ashore in some areas because of the terrorist actions that happened in those days) and on the QD as soon as they pipe that we are anchored. I get changed and head up to the QD and they have just posted the watch. They lower and bring around the motor whale boat and lower the gangway. The Bosun Senior Chief is first off, then me, then Doc. And we take off to the pier in Haifa. Apparently, Bosun had an abscessed tooth and needed a root canal.

We pull up pier side and there is a taxi waiting for us. We get in and drive about 5-10 miles into old Haifa, to an Orthodontist office. The Orthodontist waiting for us.

We go inside the dentist office and he puts each of in a room. It looks like a nice dental office. He goes to see Bosun and gives him a shot or two of Novocain. He comes in my room and gives me two shots. He says he will be back in a few minutes when I'm numb. Shortly after that I hear him start working on Bosun. Then I hear Bosun hollering. Then dentist comes into my room. I open my mouth and he reached in and yanked out the broken half of my tooth (and it feels like half my brain) before the Novocain has taken full effect. He says he will be back in a few more minutes and goes back to Bosun. He goes back and forth with us working on each if us for about an hour (or 10 it seemed like) until he says, "Well, you're done."

He sits me up in the dentist chair and while he finished up on Bosun I am looking around his office. There is his dental school diploma on the wall. From the University of Kentucky. How cool is that?

When we are done a taxi takes us back to the pier. Doc tells me the ship has already started liberty and I don't have to go back to the ship until end of the day. Then he says, "Tomorrow morning, come up to medical and I'll give you some pain killer that won't keep you from drinking some beer". Guess the Doc just assumed I might be on liberty the next day too....
