

The reunion committee has completed our annual reunion site survey trip and are pleased to announce we have again found a very nice hotel, Hyatt Regency SFO Airport and believe we have negotiated an excellent rate for the reunion period. Some of the highlights are: daily room rate of \$207, which includes breakfast for 2, they are NOT charging for any of the meeting spaces and setup and break down of the rooms, we will receive a 15% discount on F&B, discounted beer and wine for the dinners and we will also be allowed to bring in our own alcohol and snacks to the hotel (with some restrictions).
